The origin of the Vidyapeeth dates back to the pre-independence period - when immediately after the demise of Lokmanya Bal Gangadhar Tilak (1921), his follower Mahatma Gandhi mooted the idea of establishing a university in his memory and thus the followers of Lokmanya Tilak came together and established Tilak Maharashtra Vidyapeeth (TMV) on 6th May 1921. After Independence, the Vidyapeeth was awarded the status of 'Deemed to be University' by the Govt. of India in 1987 in recognition of its contribution in the field of education. Today, the Vidyapeeth offers various courses through 12 Boards of Studies. At present, the Vidyapeeth offers various programmes of education. Some of the programmes are- BCA, BBA, Journalism, B.Com, BHMCT (Hotel Management), BPT, B.Sc.-Nursing, B.Com, MA (Social Sciences), MBA, MSW, LLB., MJ, B.Lib.& I.Sc, M.Lib.& I.Sc, MA (Japanese, Sanskrit, Indology), M.A. in Ayurved and M.Com.

About Nehru Institute of Social Sciences (NISS)

The Nehru Institute of Social Sciences was established in the year 1969 as a post-graduate department and research centre. This is the pioneer department in the interdisciplinary programme and research. In the later phase, as per the suggestions given by University Grants Commission, New Delhi, separate four independent post-graduate departments were established, namely 'Economics', 'History', 'Political Science' and 'Sociology'. The department has completed a significant number of research projects funded by central government agencies as UGC, New Delhi, ICSSR, New Delhi and ICHR, New Delhi.
